In response to your correspondence dated February 15th, 2018, the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) - International Events and Convention Services Program (IECSP) officially recognizes the following event:

The provisions of Tariff Item **9993.00.00.00** has been extended to you.

It should be noted that exhibitors may import goods temporarily as outlined in the provisions of tariff classification **9993.00.00.00** duty free, on the condition that the goods will be exported from Canada upon the completion of the event.

Goods imported for sale are not eligible under tariff No. 9993.00.00.00. These goods must be accounted for at time of release on a [Form B3](#), *Canada Customs Coding Form*. Commercial release processing is fully explained in Customs Memorandum [D17-1-5](#).

Please be advised that the following goods qualify for temporary importation under this tariff item:

1. Racing vehicles
2. Trailers and conveyances for moving racing vehicles
3. Repair parts and repair equipment such as tires, wheels and spare parts
4. Tools and portable shop equipment required to maintain a racing vehicle
5. Mobile accommodations, mobile kitchens, and related equipment when imported to support the racing team and support personnel and used to promote race related activities.

6. Safety vehicles such as first response vehicles and mobile medical unit and related equipment for use solely at the racing event
7. A maximum of three full fuel taker trucks for each racing event. The fuel will be for use only in racing vehicles and not support vehicles. Following the race, any remaining fuel in the take trucks will be exported.
8. Television productions trucks and related equipment to produce segments covering your racing events.

Fuel in excess of the normal tank capacity of the racing vehicles, oil, grease, and other consumables are subject to payment of duties and taxes at time of importation into Canada. Listings of goods being imported should be prepared indicating description, quantity and values.

Under certain circumstances, the CBSA will require a security deposit on goods temporarily imported to Canada. These goods are normally documented on the Temporary Admission Permit (Form E29B).

At the time of exportation, goods granted temporary admission on a Form E29B must be presented along with importer's/owner's copies of the appropriate documentation to CBSA for verification and certification. This presentation may occur at a CBSA office inland or at the port of export, depending on the circumstances involved and is necessary for you to receive a refund of any securities posted. Please note that the refund is not immediate.

Provided, at the time of importation, the conditions of temporary importation previously described are met, the IECSP recommends that both the requirement for the goods to be documented on a Form E29B and the posting of a security deposit be waived.

CBSA requires everyone seeking admission into Canada to properly declare themselves to CBSA by providing accurate identification. CBSA will accept a valid passport as proof of citizenship.

Persons who have been convicted of any criminal offences may be inadmissible to Canada. For more information please visit: <http://www.cic.gc.ca/english/information/inadmissibility/index.asp>.

If you have attendees from visa-requiring countries (<http://www.cic.gc.ca/english/visit/visas.asp>), please contact the Special Events Unit of Citizenship and Immigration Canada (CIC) at special.events@cic.gc.ca with the specifics of your event. They will assess the visa requirements of your event.

Foreign nationals may engage in exhibiting, selling or displaying goods without a work permit provided they are not selling to the general public. Direct sales to the general public require a work permit. For more information please visit: <http://www.cic.gc.ca/english/work/index.asp>.

To facilitate border procedures it is recommended that anyone destined for your event be provided with a copy of this letter for presentation to the Border Services Officer upon their arrival to Canada.

In conjunction with the presentation of this Recognition Letter, **an itemized list of goods including a description, country of origin, quantity and value is required for presentation to CBSA.** If your event materials will be imported by a commercial carrier or courier service, a copy of this letter should also be attached to any shipping documents.

Any goods imported as “giveaways” or imported for sale must be accounted for at time of release on a Form B3, Canada Customs Coding Form with all applicable duties and/or taxes collected at the time of importation.
